Here's How to Get Started

If you want your master's degree...

This option is available whether or not you have a provisional license.

- Apply to Radford University as a degree seeking student. You should apply directly to the College of Graduate Studies and Research. All the information you need for the application process can be found at http://www.radford.edu/content/grad/home/admissions/apply.html.
- If you have a provisional license, send <u>Dr. Gilbert</u> a copy of your provisional license and letter from the VDOE listing the courses you need to take.
- Complete the online form to let Dr. Gilbert know which classes you want to take.

If you have a provisional ECSE license or expect to get one within the next year...

Apply to Radford University as a non-degree seeking student. After creating your profile you will select the program for which you are applying. Select "Non-Degree Seeking" for program.

Funding

We have funding from the VDOE to support classes require for licensure at \$400/course currently. If you are employed by a Virginia public school system, including working as a paraprofessional, you can apply for the Virginia Educator Reduced Tuition rate by completing this <u>form</u>.
